The course schedule is published before advising and registration begins for each semester. In many cases, important information about new courses, course prerequisites, registration restrictions and dates are provided on an accompanying information sheet. Changes made after publication of this schedule will be made available on-line through the internet at <http://www.memphisseminary.edu>. Registration materials (e.g., registration form, method of payment form, etc.) can be picked up in or outside the Registrar's Office. Afterwards, students should review degree check sheet and select courses during an appointment with an academic advisor. You may register **as long as your account is paid in full** by providing the Registrar's Office with a signed registration form and other materials needed to complete this process. For each course, the following information is given: course number (which includes a discipline prefix and 5 digit number); course title (prerequisite follow title, when space permits); credit hours; days; time; room; and instructor's name. Each course that requires a prerequisite bears an (*) asterisk while those that have a preaching element bear a superscript symbol (†) within the course number area. Additionally, the superscript symbol (♯) is used to designate courses that are Cross Cultural. Moreover, when the course title is lengthy, see the information sheet for important details regarding the course.

NEW COURSES (see Registrar's Office for course descriptions not listed)

PM 02596 Money, Markets & Ministry: Economic Reality and Christian Responsibility - The purpose of this course will be to introduce basic economic theory, how economic reality impacts the work of ministry in parish and non-parish settings, and how pastors can effectively work within the economic system to fund ministry, engage persons in exercising Christian responsibility to care for the poor, and exercise fiduciary responsibility in leadership.

CM/TH 05725 God and the Other - We tend to articulate problems in the world as isolated issues that can be solved without reference to underlying and often hidden presuppositions. While conflicts may seem to arise from ideological or theological differences, Emmanuel Levinas, one of the seminal philosophical and religious thinkers of the 20th century, suggests that our discomfort with difference may impact our good intentions to relate to the "other" in the world that God so loves. In this class, students will have the opportunity to explore the ways in which a call to the other as "neighbor" relates to missional and theological perspectives. They will also consider God's mission to the world through a reflective, contextual and global standpoint.

AA/WP/SR 01911 African American Preaching: The Rhetoric, The Ritual, The Reality - This course will help the student fulfill the following seminary and departmental educational goals: 1. Critical thinking; 2. Multicultural understanding; and 3. Christian faith.

CH 02885 Wesleyan Spiritual Theology – Using John Wesley's life as a backdrop, this class will walk students through the development of his theology over the course of his lifetime. Beginning with the influence that his (and Suzanna's) ancestry already contributed to his life, even before his birth, his life and the theology it produced will then be divided into three fairly evident parts: 1. his early life; 2. his middle years; 3. his later years.

COURSE INFORMATION

WP 01104 Worship and Preaching Practicum will be offered in two different time slots this semester.

PM 01100 Supervised Parish Practicum: 1.) The required prerequisite is PM 10000 Christian Ministry; 2.) Class meetings are one a week for 90 minutes; 3.) You will be required to find a supervisor who has a M.Div., has served in parish ministry for at least five years, and is currently serving in a parish; 4.) Your supervisor does not need to be on site at your parish setting, nor does he/she need to be associated with your parish setting; 5.) You and your supervisor will meet once every two weeks during the semester; 6.) During this course, you will conduct a project of your own design within your parish setting under the supervision of your supervisor; 7.) If you are not currently involved in a parish setting, there is still a possibility to take this course. See Barry Anderson for more information; 8.) Your project will have two areas of focus: a.) improving or establishing some program within your parish setting, and b.) your own spiritual growth; 9.) Mandatory Workshop scheduled on Monday, August 25 at 9:00 a.m. Students will need to join the workshop at 9:30 a.m. 10.) After priority registration for PM 01100, students will receive an information packet and forms in late July (complete and return by Friday, August 1); and 11.) Supervisor must be present at PM 01100 Workshop on August 25. The first class meeting is on Monday, August 28.
